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Yes, she's a Harvard grad who helms Litex, the ceiling-fan and light-fixture empire based in Grand Prairie — but she's a woman of rather discerning style, too. She collects couture, she has shopped right off the runways at the Paris shows and her own James McInroe–designed home has been in *Papercity*. Now, Jean Liu turns the stylish tables: She has just joined a heady list of designers who have conjured model units at The Residences at The Ritz-Carlton, Dallas. (Her cohorts have been Ann Sutherland, Jan Showers, Laura Hunt, Carleton Varney and Barry Williams.) For the 23-story tower, Liu invented a cosmopolitan place, filled with contemporary art, sophisticated accessories and plush, Deco-inspired furniture. As for the props?
